South Suburban Celebrates Grand Re-Opening of Holly Tennis Center

South Suburban Park and Recreation District informally celebrated the grand re-opening of its Holly Tennis Center on Aug. 20. The project was jointly funded by South Suburban and the City of Centennial's Shareback Funds from the Arapahoe County Open Space Tax.

Holly Tennis Center, originally built in 1978, received a complete makeover, including six new courts; new fencing, nets and posts; new lighting and a new lighting control system; and new ADA access to the courts. While the main project is completely finished, landscaping will be added this fall and wind screens will be installed next season.

Others involved in the project include US Tennis Association of Colorado with its Adopt-A-Court Grant for divider fencing. Design consultants included Architectural Engineering Design Group and Martin/Martin Consulting Engineers, and contractor Renner Sports of Denver.

Holly Tennis Center is one of four South Suburban locations that feature six lighted courts, and host league competitions. The new courts are post-tension concrete with divider fencing between them. The courts also include 60 ft. lines for juniors, as Holly Tennis is one of the host sites for Junior Team Tennis Play-offs.

Although South Suburban programming takes precedence, the courts are open to the public and are free of charge. Patrons can activate the lights, and they automatically shut off at 10 pm during summer hours. Lessons will be taught at Holly Tennis through the fall season. Holly Tennis Center is located at 6651 S. Krameria Way, just behind Holly Pool in Centennial. For more information, visit www.sspr.org.
